FACTS Re-enrollment – Open Through Individualized Email w/Link FACTS New Student Application - Open FACTS Financial Aid Application - Open

Attending MQA means using FACTS. All re-enrollments for current students, applications for new students and enrollments of newly accepted students are done through FACTS. So is application for financial aid. Each of these is a step to take in the FACTS system.

Students currently enrolled at MQA will receive a re-enrollment email from FACTS to begin the process of enrolling for the 2025-2026 school year. These students do not need to submit an inquiry or an application. Each child will have his/her own unique re-enrollment link. The email will have this subject line: Reenrollment for 2025-2026; there will be one email for each child.

Families with students who will be joining the MQA classes, but who are not yet attending MQA, should complete the inquiry form using the button on our website or by clicking on this link: https://mqa-pa.client.renweb.com/oa/inquiry.cfm?memberid=15769. This is step one! Step two and three follow! After the inquiry is complete, an application for the new student is submitted. Upon approval of the application, an email is sent offering a link for enrollment. This email will come from FACTS.

If you have any questions, please contact the office. Part of the enrollment/re-enrollment process is choosing the payment plan for your family. Regardless of what is chosen, re-enrollment and setting up the payment plan both have a fee. The process is delayed until the fees are paid.

Families who want to apply for financial aid for their students for the 2025-26 school year will only be required to use their 2023 tax returns. If there is a reason where a using the 2024 tax return is beneficial to the family, the 2024 tax return can be uploaded once the forms are ready and FACTS will recalculate need. The financial aid application for 25-26 school year must be completed to receive aid. The aid application opened in November 2024 and continues. Financial aid applications also have a fee determined by FACTS for processing the application. Until it is paid, the application is not verified/completed, and therefore no aid can be given until this step is completed.

As a reminder: Applying for Financial Aid and Re-enrolling for the 2025-2026 school year are two different items to prepare for the upcoming school year. Please read this carefully and call the office with any questions.


